# Ag Increment Report for Brown County \$51 million

# Lunch-N-Learn Horticulture Series:

- 86% of program participation plant to make changes to their landscape based on information presented
- 65% anticipate an economic benefit

#### Range/Brush

- 98% of program participants plan on doing brush control on their land in the next 2 years.
- 97% plant to implement recommended practice/technology
- 92% anticipate an economic benefit
- 70% anticipate a benefit of \$5-\$15/acre
- Total anticipated benefit of \$400,00+

#### Beef Cattle

- Focus on best management practices cow risk/drought management, cow marketing, reproductive efficiency, & cattle liability
- Program participants manage over 70,000 acres and 9500 head of beef cattle (equals 41% of total cattle numbers in Brown County).
- 70% anticipates an economic benefit of \$11 \$30/head by utilizing recommended practices
