Healthy County Wellness Program is a free program through BlueCross BlueShield that offers many different avenues to get and stay healthy.

- Received Iris Stagner Award for 2018
- Challenges
 - o 34 participated 20 completed 6K
 - o 33 participated 24 completed County vs County
 - o 28 participated 22 completed Keep America Active
 - o 37 participated (results aren't in yet) Health for the Holidays
 - o 20 (not including last challenge) employees earned \$50 Amazon gift card
- Naturally Slim 10-week online weight management class
 - o 5 participated 3 completed class
- · Quarterly "Lunch and learns" with guest speakers
 - o "6 Ways to Overcome Stress" by Mark Zollitch from TAC
 - o Breakfast and employee survey over health and wellness
 - 42 surveys collected

- County employees have created their own contests in between the state challenges.

Car Safety was an identified issue from Texas Community Futures Forum.

- 2 car seat checkup events
 - o 49 seats inspected
 - o 27 new seats issued
 - o 7 children completely unrestrained
 - 0 \$57,258.75
- 3 Mature Driver programs presented to 20 people
- "Carfit" is a program to educate mature drivers on the best practices/settings of the car to prevent or reduce injuries. I was certified as a "Carfit" technician and will be hosting "Carfit" events in 2020.

December 9, 2019 (Exhibi+#11) Childcare Conference was a multi-county event that provided training for people who work in the childcare industry. Specialists from AgriLife and local professionals were the presenters. 43 people attended and each earned 6 clock hours of training.

Financial Wellness - taught about saving, spending, credit, identity theft and Medicare Fraud.

- Received Family Development and Resource Management Award for 2018.
- Money Basics taught basic money management at The ARK to 6 people.
- Texas Senior Medicare Patrol continuation of 2018 program.
 - o 3 programs, 44 participants
- Building Wealth on a Ramen Noodle Budget 2-hour workshop about saving, spending, credit management and protecting yourself from identity theft.
 - o 52 people attended, from 12 years old to 60+ years of age.
 - o Sponsored by First Central Credit Union.
 - Over \$2,600 worth of "free money" given out from local businesses.

Food Handler's is a 2-hour program, which is accredited by the Department of State Health Services, providing training for front-line food service workers on the basic principles of food safety.

Food Protection Management is a two-day certified food manager program that prepares food service workers to sit for the state Certified Food Manager exam.
