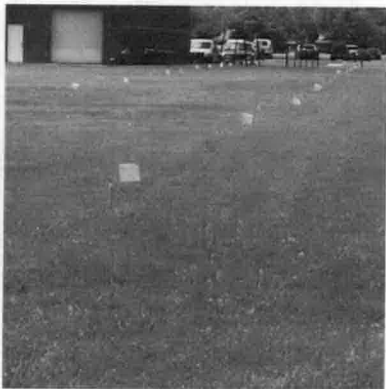
- April – July
- Fruit Trees for Our Area, Landscape Pests and Diseases, Earthkind Landscapes, Lawn/Turf Management

Range/Brush

- 96% of program participants plan on doing brush control on their land in the next 2 years.
- 97% plant to implement recommended practice/technology
- 91% anticipate an economic benefit
- 90% anticipate a benefit of \$6/acre or more
- Total anticipated benefit of \$440,00+

Livestock Predator Management

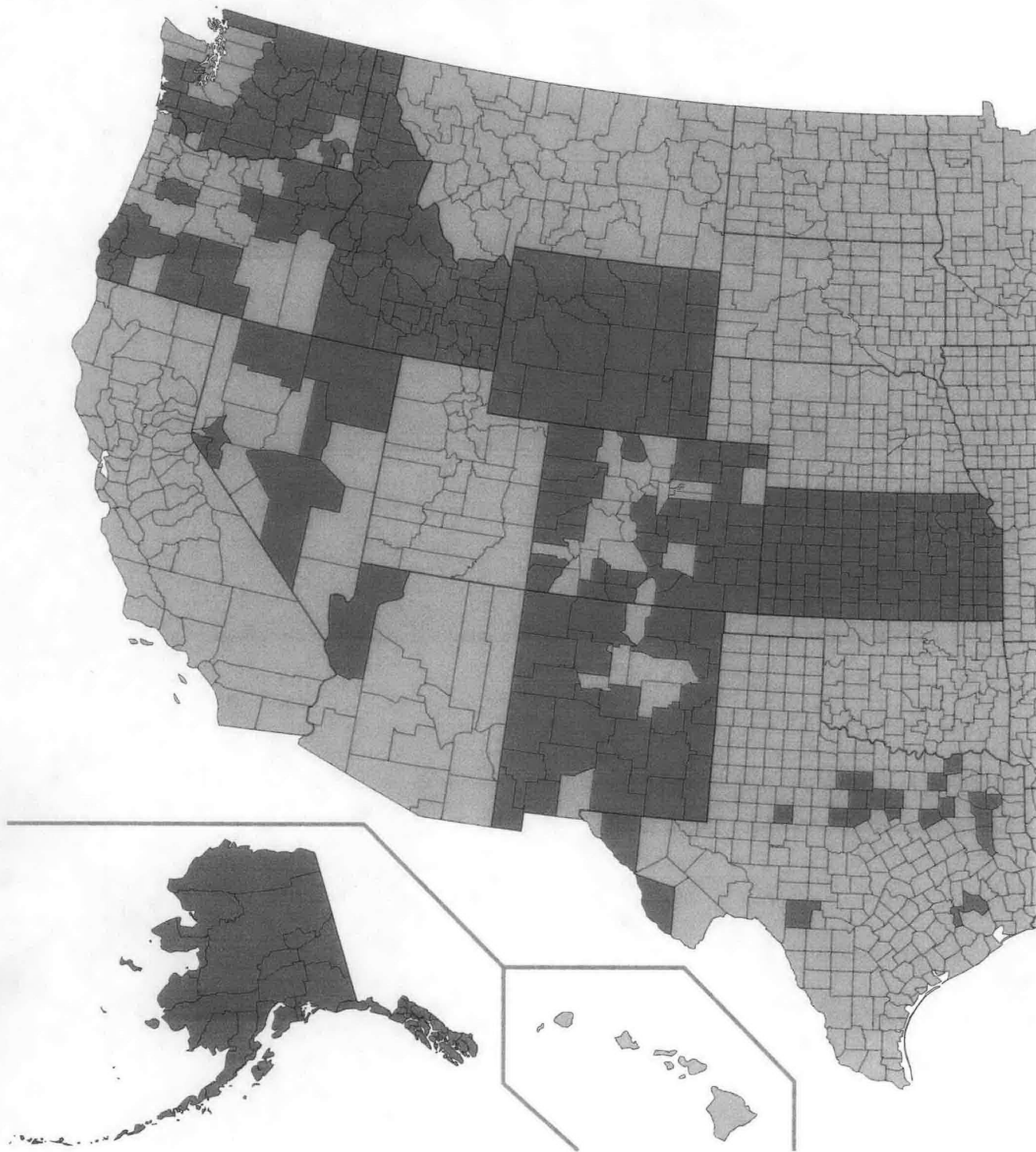
- 98% of program respondents increased their knowledge of identifying predators and their damage
- 85% of program respondents estimate deer/exotic losses to predators
- Program respondents indicate livestock/wildlife dollar losses to predators = \$2.36/acre represented
- Total estimated economic benefit \$226,600
