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GARDEN OPERATIONS REPORT November/December 2022

November

November and December production revolved mostly around digging sweet potatoes and picking what remained of the tomatoes and peppers. An unusually large number of green tomatoes and peppers were harvested before the first cold snap, and a surprisingly large number survived those cold temperatures as well.

The extreme cold right before Christmas finally shut everything down, with the exception of some spinach that one of our gardeners had planted. Beds that had been planted with strawberries and some cover crops were covered with both straw and sheets. Most survived-with the exception of the Pacific Gold mustard that had been planted as a biofumigant to aid in the control of nematode. Those beds will receive shrimp meal this spring, another method of controlling nematode. It also appears that one of the irrigation controls was affected by the cold and will be checked out soon.

So, another year is in the books. As has been stated before, there seem to have been more challenges this year than normal- an early cold snap that completely destroyed the plum harvest, extreme heat throughout the summer which minimized crop production, and more garden pests than normal. Even the squirrels decided to get in on the action by digging in the beds and chewing through drip lines. Despite all the challenges, we are pleased with what we have accomplished this year. Wheelbarrows of food were shared weekly with the people at Salvation Army along with trip after trip made to Good Samaritan to provide fresh produce to those they serve. Thanks to all who made this possible.
