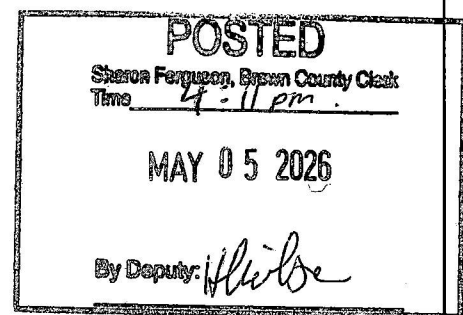




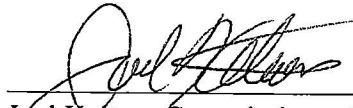

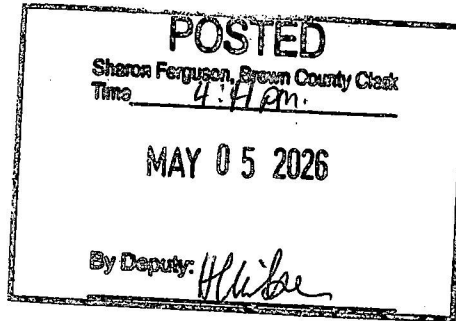

V. BURN BAN: Consider and take appropriate action regarding the county-wide burn ban and/or restricted fireworks (if drought conditions are determined to exist by the Texas Fore Service.)

After discussion, Commissioner Chastain moved that the Court sign an Order Authorizing Memorial Day Fireworks Sales beginning May 20, 2026, and ending at midnight May 25, 2026. Commissioner Trawick seconded the motion, and the Court voted 4-0 to approve. The burn ban remains lifted. (Exhibit #2)

- a. Consideration and possible approval of payment to Don King for surveying right of way of portion of CR 192, CR 193, CR 196. Presented by Don King, County Surveyor.**

After discussion with Brown County Surveyor Don King, Commissioner Traweek moved the Court to authorize an expenditure of \$2,500.00 for payment to Don King for surveying the right of ways of portions of County Road 192, County Road 193, and County Road 196. This expenditure will be paid from the Surveyor budget. Commissioner Chastain seconded the motion, and the Court voted 4-0 to approve.

- b. Consideration and possible approval of the plat of the MW Boysen Estate. Presented by Don King, County Surveyor.**

Commissioner Traweek moved that the Court approve the filing of the plat of the MW Boysen Estate, in Precinct #4, as presented by County Surveyor Don King. Commissioner Reid seconded the motion, and the Court voted 4-0 to approve.

- c. Consideration and possible approval of the recommendation for electric provider contract. Presented by County Auditor's Office.**

**After discussion with Assistant County Auditor Josie Contreras, Commissioner Chastain moved that the Court approve TXU Energy Retail Company LLC, as the County electric provider with a five-year contract. Commissioner Reid seconded the motion, and the Court voted 4-0 to approve.

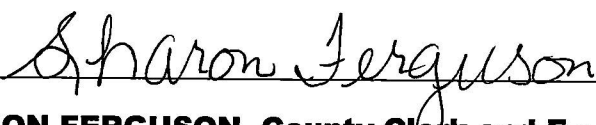
