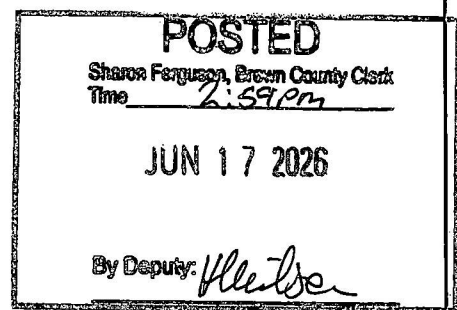




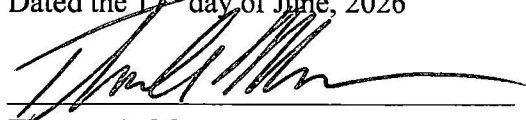

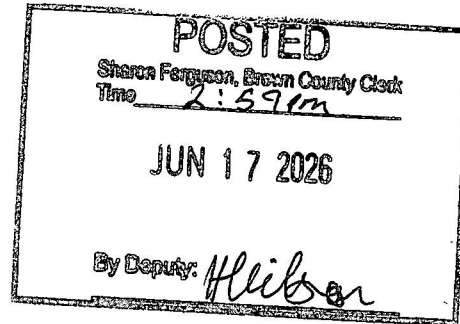

VI. PROCLAMATION:

a. 250th Anniversary of the United States of America.

Acting Brown County Judge Tom Munson read a Proclamation Recognizing The 250TH Anniversary Of The United States Of America. Commissioner Kelton moved that the Commissioners Court of Brown County, Texas, does hereby recognize and celebrate the 250th Anniversary of the United States of America and encourages all citizens to participate in appropriate commemorative activities honoring our Nation's past, celebrating its present, and inspiring future generations. Commissioner Traweek seconded the motion, and the Court voted 5-0 to approve. (Exhibit #1)

VII. BURN BAN: Consider and take appropriate action regarding the county-wide burn ban.

After discussion no action was taken. The burn ban remains lifted.

VIII. BUSINESS TO BE DISCUSSED AND CONSIDERED FOR

APPROVAL:

- a. **Consideration and possible approval to purchase additional data extraction from i3Verticals to support Tyler Technologies' records migration for the Justice of the Peace offices. Presented by IT.**

Commissioner Chastain moved that the Court approve an expenditure of \$7,500.00 to purchase additional data extraction, from i3Verticals, to support Tyler Technologies' records migration for the Justice of the Peace offices, as presented by Sam Goldsmith, Goldsmith Solutions. Commissioner Kelton seconded the motion, and the Court voted 5-0 to approve. (Exhibit #2)

- b. **Consideration and possible approval for the County Judge to execute Rural Ambulance Service Grant Agreement. Presented by Cliff Karnes, Grants Administrator.**

Commissioner Kelton moved that the Court authorize Acting Brown County Judge Munson to execute a Grant Agreement, between the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts and Brown County, Texas, which establishes a grant program to provide financial assistance to qualified ambulance service providers in certain rural counties. Commissioner Traweck seconded the motion, and the Court voted 5-0 to approve. (Exhibit #3)

- c. Consideration and possible approval for the County Judge to execute an Emergency Communication Platform Use Agreement between Brown County and the City of Early. Presented by Cliff Karnes, Emergency Management Coordinator.**

Commissioner Reid moved that the Court authorize Acting Brown County Judge Munson to execute an Emergency Communication Platform Use Agreement between Brown County, Texas, acting through its authorized Emergency Management authority, and the City of Early, Texas concerning the HQE Systems SiRcom SMART Alert platform, for the dissemination of emergency and public safety notifications, as presented by Emergency Management Coordinator Cliff Karnes. Commissioner Kelton seconded the motion, and the Court voted 5-0 to approve. (Exhibit #4)

IX. FINANCIAL: Payment of bills.

Commissioner Chastain moved that the claims, as presented by Interim Brown County Auditor Josie Contreras, be approved. Commissioner Reid seconded the motion, and the Court voted 5-0 to approve. (Exhibit #5)

Acting Brown County Judge Munson adjourned the Commissioners' Court at 1:50 p.m.
