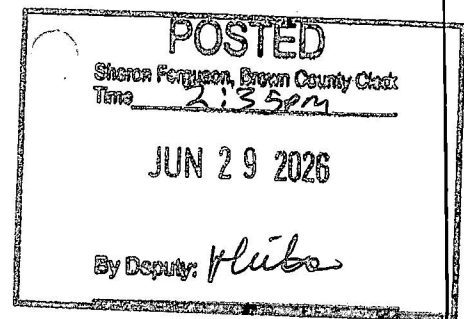

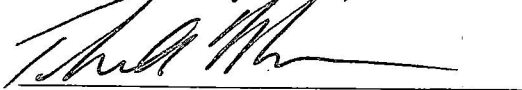

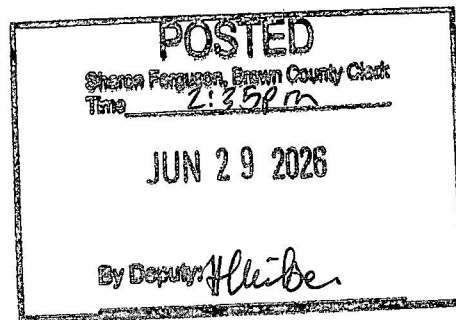

**Commissioner Reid moved that the Court approve to hire Mike Ramon as a part time road hand for Precinct #3 effective July 6, 2026. Commissioner Trawick seconded the motion, and the Court voted 5-0 to approve.**

**b. Joel Kelton, Commissioner Precinct 2.**

**Commissioner Kelton moved that the Court approve a salary increase for Zonder Easterling, road hand for Precinct #2 effective July 1, 2026. Commissioner Chastain seconded the motion, and the Court voted 5-0 to approve. (Exhibit #3)**

After discussion with Brown County Elections Administrator Brenda Arp, Commissioner Chastain moved that the Court approve the destruction of all parts of the elections VOTEC equipment that is not usable. Commissioner Kelton seconded the motion, and the Court voted 5-0 to approve. (Exhibit #4)**

**b. Consideration and possible approval to remove broken ice machine and install replacement for Precinct 1 barn. Presented by Kirk Chastain, Commissioner Precinct 1.**

**Commissioner Chastain moved that the Court authorize him to purchase a replacement ice machine for \$7,200.00, from Frost Air, for the Precinct #1 barn. Commissioner Reid seconded the motion, and the Court voted 5-0 to approve.**

**c. Consideration and possible approval of a paving bid from Blackhawk Services for a portion of CR 334. Presented by David Reid, Commissioner Precinct 3.**

**Commissioner Reid moved that the Court approve a bid, of \$14,750.00, from Blackhawk Services LLC for paving 11,800 square feet of County Road #334, in Precinct #3. Commissioner Kelton seconded the motion, and the Court voted 4-0 to approve with Commissioner Traweek abstaining. (Exhibit #5)**

- d. Consideration and possible approval of Application to Install a Private Line on CR 306 by Zephyr WSC. Presented by David Reid, Commissioner Precinct 3.**

**Commissioner Reid moved that the Court approve an Application, made by Zephyr WSC, to Install a Private Line within the right-of-way of County Road #306, in Precinct #3; subject to Brown County specifications for cutting a road. Commissioner Traweek seconded the motion, and the Court voted 5-0 to approve. (Exhibit #6)**

- e. Consideration and possible approval of action regarding Brown County Employee health care coverage renewal through the Texas Association of Counties for FY 26-27.**

**After discussion, Acting Judge Munson moved that the Court approve Texas Association of Counties Health And Employee Benefits Pool Medical Plan Option 3/Plan 1520-NG/RX-5B-NG, for the Fiscal Year 2026-2027 Brown County Health Insurance Renewal for employees. Commissioner Chastain seconded the motion, and the Court voted 5-0 to approve. (Exhibit #7)**

- f. Consideration and possible approval of action regarding adoption of a Health Reimbursement Arrangement (HRA). Presented by Tom Munson, Acting County Judge.**

**After discussion, Acting Judge Munson moved that the Court authorize him to pursue a contract, with Higginbotham, regarding the adoption of a Health Reimbursement Arrangement (HRA), for Brown County employees, as is laid out in the handout that was provided, to the Court, and is listed as Exhibit #8 to these minutes. Commissioner Kelton seconded the motion, and the Court voted 5-0 to approve. (Exhibit #8)**
